WORDS FROM THE PASTOR

I and U

There's a hackneyed phrase used by sports announcers and coaches in the U.S. who are trying to motivate their athletes to cooperate to achieve victories that goes like this: "There's no 'I' in 'team'."

This line came to mind as I passed by our church sign the other day and noticed that the letter 'i' had fallen out* of the name of our church so that it now read "Sant ago". Of course, I thought, that is just what Jesus told his disciples when he caught them quarrelling about their relative power and rank in the kingdom he was promising: *"The last shall be first and the first last"* (Matthew 20:16) and *"Whoever wants to be a leader among you, must be your servant."* (Matthew 20:26)

In spite of the fact that the name of the church was now misspelled, I couldn't think of a better way to represent this congregation! We are a church where people from across 18 different denominational traditions – representing all the various theological controversies throughout the history of Christianity! – have set aside our various claims to "superior" spiritual insight and practice, and instead, celebrate our unity in Christ Jesus as Lord!

I then noticed that another letter was missing: the 'u' from the word church. This one troubled me. While we are all called to subsume our individual wills to the will of God for the sake of our common life and witness, we are also called to recognize the unique value and gifts that each person brings. While the 'I' is often problematic, the "u" is always absolutely necessary.

I suppose we'll get around to replacing our sign someday. But in the meantime, we'll enjoy the occasional opportunity for reflection it provides us. And we'll look for YOU in church!

*(Over many years, the plastic letters used on the sign have been heated by the sun and become fragile; many of them are broken and unusable, and new ones are no longer available for purchase. There is a process underway to replace the sign in the near future. In the meantime, we are using glue to attach the letters).

December - Mark 1:1,8 (NRSV)
