Mission

Statement of Faith

- God: We worship one God in three Persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The central doctrines of our faith are contained in the Apostles' and the Nicene creeds.
 Salvation: We believe that our sin separates us from God. Reconciliation with God and eternal life come only by the grace of God in Jesus Christ who through the Holy Spirit calls us to repentance, forgives our sins and empowers us to lead new lives characterized by love, joy and compassion.
 The Bible: The Bible is the word of God, inspired by the Holy Spirit. It is the primary authority regarding matters of Christian love, hope, faith, living, teaching, doctrine, discipline and morality and contains all things necessary for salvation. Scripture in its entirety (both the Old and New Testaments) must be interpreted through that same Holy Spirit, in the light of Jesus' birth, life,
- The Church: We hold the church to be the body of Christ, the community of believers, created and empowered by the Holy Spirit to advance the Kingdom of God and fulfil the commission to make disciples from people of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and teaching them to observe all that Jesus commanded.
